She is a painter, but some of her most interesting work has been rendered without a stroke. Fascinated with the "process" of culture, she has made artworks by drawing together (replicating imperfectly), "corporations", that don't pay dividends; "products" that are not for sale; and even an a-political "political party". In concrete form, her works resemble "artifacts" left in the wake of an idea. For the last several years, her work has been focused towards, in her own words, "having a conversation with the canvas and discovering images that appear, and change, and vanish even while looking".

BETH HAMMACK

Beth Hammack is an Oklahoma City artist who continues to gain momentum in both private and corporate collections. 


DON NARCOMEY

JUDITH TURNER

Judith Turner is a notable American photographer whose signature style consists of highly abstract, black-and-white images of architecture that play with the ambiguity of light, shadow and tonality to heighten the aesthetic character of her subject and reveal visual relationships not readily apparent. Turner's training as a designer allows her to visually understand an architect's intention and to reveal it in compositions that she constructs and edits through her camera work. Her photography is known for its bold, graphic style and includes the work of such eminent architects as Frank Gehry, Zaha Hadid, Renzo Piano and Frank Lloyd Wright. Her photographs are in prestigious public and corporate collections throughout the United States and abroad.

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CAROL BEESLEY

Carol Beesley's artistic practice joins photography and painting to produce vibrant landscapes documenting Oklahoma and the Southwest. On-site personal visits and photographs chart the geological reality being represented and through a grid system, she meticulously transfers the image to the painting's surface. To capture the sense of place beyond the mere physical presence, she interprets the image in intense color as if caught in a fleeting moment of light. Beesley received her MFA from UCLA and has been a recipient of an NEH fellowship to study art history at Columbia University. Her work has been widely exhibited in the United States and in France through solo shows and a recent retrospective.

Denise Duong, who studied at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, creates lyrical mixed media paintings on canvas. Each painting tells a story. Some are complete short stories; others are epic in their ability to evoke experiential memories and themes, depending on the lenses the viewer chooses to wear. Her paintings' whimsical characters reference real life romanticized by imagination and embellished with elements of surprise. Duong layers her paintings with paper, fabric, and paint, adding depth and complexity to her images. Her artwork encourages us to forget the tragedy and ugliness that we encounter every day and to "savor life by absorption of every great moment." Denise's sought-after paintings are collected throughout the United States.

JONATHAN W. HILS

Jonathan W. Hils' work explores the relationship between interior and exterior space, permeable and retentive. He achieves varying line/light density through obscure fabrication and drawing techniques inspired by nature, science and industry. Absence and presence are integral to his work which intertwines substantial aspects of physical complexity which coalesce into works with a distinct sense of delicacy and order. Hils earned a BFA in Studio Art from Georgia State University, an MFA in Sculpture from Tulane University, and was selected for the John Michael Kohler artist residency in 2005. Currently an Associate Professor of Sculpture at the University of Oklahoma, his works are included in public, private and corporate collections across the United States.




