# JRB Art at the Elms Presents Beth Hammack, "Birds Utopia" and University of Oklahoma School of Visual Arts Faculty Group Exhibition Bette Talvacchia, and Faculty

OKLAHOMA CITY – An opening reception will be held for two shows, a solo show featuring abstract painter Beth Hammack and a group show featuring fourteen faculty members from the University of Oklahoma School of Visual Arts (SoVA), from 6-10pm, May 3<sup>rd</sup> during the Paseo Arts District's First Friday Gallery Walk. The exhibitions will be on display until May 31<sup>st</sup>. The exhibits, opening reception and artist talks are free to the public.

Celebrated Oklahoma City artist Beth Hammack has spent her career in art, jewelry and interior design. She has a Bachelor's Degree in Mathematics from the University of Oklahoma and has studied at the Chicago Art Institute and the London City School of Arts. JRB Art Gallery is excited to showcase Hammack's large abstract paintings in this new show "Birds Utopia" so titled because she has hidden birds in every piece. Hammack's work traditionally incorporates drawing, subtle hues, disguised symbols and barely legible writing. As an abstract artist she leaves the interpretation of her work to the viewer and purposefully wires her painting to be hung vertically or horizontally.

SoVA at the University of Oklahoma is dedicated to the study of visual arts, design and art history and is run by faculty from various artistic backgrounds. As Director, Dr.Bette Talvacchia states "the richness and depth of the differing approaches, as the viewer can easily imagine, is a treasured aspect of our program, and one that is crucial for SoVA to cultivate." Master of Fine Arts, University of Kansas and Bachelor of Fine Arts, University of Central Missouri. Her ceramic sculptures showcase her perception of human fragility. She is completing her first year as Assistant Professor of ceramics.

# **Doug Casebeer**

Master of Fine Arts, Alfred University and Bachelor of Fine Arts, Wichita State University. Doug is the first Artist-in-Residence of ceramics in OU SoVA's history.

# Jason Cytacki

Bachelor of Fine Arts, Indiana University South Bend and Master of Fine Arts, Notre Dame University. He explores Americans through the lens of history and pop culture and expresses his perspective through painting. He is Associate Professor of painting and drawing.

Bachelor of Fine Arts, Cooper Union and Master of Fine Arts, Ohio State University. She works as a new media graphic artist and is Assistant Professor in the Art, Technology and Culture program.

#### **Cathleen Faubert**

Master of Fine Arts, Tufts University/School of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. She promotes self-empowerment through photography, video and installations. Cathleen is Assistant Professor in the Art, Technology and Culture program.

Bachelor of Fine Arts, University of Nevada and Master of Fine Arts, Massachusetts College of Art. He works to combine new media with technological infrastructures.
